She's joined on the night by SHARON CORR – the eldest of The Corrs sisters and former resident of Stranmillis (random fact) for a homecoming of sorts. This multi-platinum selling songwriter is far more acclimatised to the stadium, so this intimate double headline show is a very rare treat!

BENJAMIN FRANCIS LEFTWICH

York native BENJAMIN FRANCIS LEFTWICH returns to the Empire Music Hall this March, touring new material form his third studio album Gratitude. He began playing guitar at the age of 10 and while he maintains a healthy regard for the canon – your Buckleys and your Drakes – he's as heavily informed by the music of Arcade Fire and Placebo.

With his debut album Last Smoke Before the Snowstorm saw him compared to Damien Rice and Jose Gonzalez. Sophomore After the Rain would go on to cement his reputation as one of the great up and coming artists of the Spotify era. With his new material featuring a darker, electronic edge Benjamin is definitely upping the game.
