With a sparkling career as a songwriter, knocking hits out of the ballpark for the likes of Sam Smith and Miley Cyrus. Cam's solo style is as much influenced by Joni Mitchell as Johnny Cash, and has since released two well received albums, with a third on the way.

Formed in 2013 by Darren Fletcher (who's graced the stage with Weller's own band) and featuring the Bad Manners Horn Section, funk and soul vocalist Dani Clay and Craig Read, THE STYLE COUNCILLORS recreate the musicianship and style of Weller's most underrated period.

Shout to the Top, Walls Come Tumbling Down & You're the Best Thing – the Style Council introduced a generation to a more sophisticated take on new wave.



EDWYN COLLINS GABI GARBUTT & THE ILLUMINATIONS

SUN 15 SEP | 7.30PM | £24

Co-founder of unlikely pop idols Orange Juice as well as the legendary Postcard Records, EDWYN COLLINS' pedigree was beyond reproach, even before the massive Britpop smash A Girl Like You in 1995 made him a household name.

Inspired by his return to the village where his grandfather lived, his new album, Badbea is an inspiring mix of Northern Soul stompers, reflective melancholia and relentless positivity, with all Collins' trademark ear for a pop hook. Bonafide legend and inspiration.



SAINT SISTER

THU 19 SEP | 8PM | £16

Formed in 2014, SAINT SISTER will be playing their biggest headline tour to date for one of the most talked about bands in Ireland. Debut single Madrid was playlist on Radio 1, RTE and across Europe and saw them shortlisted for the prestigious Choice Prize.

Festival appearances at Electric Picnic and Latitude and support slots with everyone from Hozier to The National pay tribute to their live chops. Essential stuff for fans of Clannad, the Staves and Kate Bush.



CLOUDBUSTING THE MUSIC OF KATE BUSH

Just passed 60, Kate Bush is the true definition of a national treasure. Topping the UK charts at the fresh age of 19 with the unique Wuthering Heights, Kate's eccentricities and disregard for the rules of songwriting saw her blossom as an alternative to the gloss of the 80s.

CLOUDBUSTING push the definition of what a tribute can do, winning over new converts and letting the quality shine through. With a set that covers all of Kate's acclaimed albums, this is a rare chance to hear songs like Hounds of Love, Wuthering Heights and Babooshka performed live on stage.



THE LOGUES

THU 26 SEP | 8.30PM | £12.50

Acclaimed as the 'most progressive folk band in Ireland', THE LOGUES, hailing from the sleepy town of Castlederg, Country Tyrone have done more to shape modern trad than any other band. It's relatively easy to make a small fortune farting out the standards for the tourist trade, but THE LOGUES are an exception to the rule, as proven by the release of hit singles I Don't Love You at All and Home.

From Donegal to Dubai, the band have taken their tunes across the globe, already drawing comparisons to the Chieftains and the Dubliners. The five piece effortlessly combine folk-rock and trad, owning the stage the way only an experienced outfit can.



ASLAN

FRI 27 & SAT 28 SEP | 8PM | £20

Are you ready to feel old? ASLAN's Goodbye Charlie Moonhead was released in 1994 – a quarter of a century ago. The exuberant and anthemic album catapulted ASLAN into the big time and saw them lauded as the 'next U2'. With unforgettable singles like Crazy Wold and Where's the Sun, the album was a vindication following a period of inter-band turmoil which saw them dismissed by certain corners of the music press. They were more than happy to prove them wrong.

Fresh from a massive sell-out show in Dublin's Iveagh Gardens, ASLAN's intimate Empire Music Hall dates are unmissable.

THE ACADEMIC

JAKE CLEMONS

You might be familiar with the name. That's because this talented young man has stepped into some mighty big shoes by taking over his Uncle's role in a little-bitty outfit called the E-Street Band. But Jake's not just the nephew of Clarence Clemons, rather a vital talent in his own right.

It's been a big year for Jake with a new album due to drop in September, heralded by a timely cover of Leonard Cohen's Democracy. The last time he was with us was a pretty damn special night, so we're thrilled to have him here for a rare Irish performance.

LA DAME BLANCHE

FRI 18 OCT | 8.30PM | £15

Cuba's LA DAME BLANCHE (the White Lady) will be performing in the Empire Music Hall as part of the Belfast International Arts Festival. The daughter of Buena La Vista Social Club founder member and artistic director Jesus "Aguaje" Ramos, Yaite Ramos has been forging her own path, combining the sounds of her youth with reggae, dancehall and cambria.

A classically trained flautist, Yaite has often performed with her father, though her own path is more urban, focusing on her mixed heritage and themes of identity and myth. And having a great time while she's at it!



UK GUNS N ROSES

When UK GUNS N ROSES promise a lead singer able to deliver the exact same unique vocal style and stage show synonymous with Axl Rose, they mean the voice, the aggression and presence, not his less punctual antics. And with full backing from the serious musicians that make up Slash, Izzy, et al, they're guaranteed to deliver.

Taking you back to the classic days of the most dangerous band in the whole world, there's a loving tribute to the band's late 80's glory days, and maybe something off Chinese Democracy too. Dust off the denim, dig out the bandana and stock up on the Jack as you lap up the world's most dangerous tribute band...

LANKUM

THU 24 OCT | 8PM | £15+BKG

Dublin folk misfits LANKUM have been earning some pretty impressive plaudits since their debut album Cold Old Fire dropped in 2014.

The Guardian called them 'the most convincing folk outfit to emerge from Ireland in years' while Mark Radcliffe said 'They do mark a turning point in folk... that authentic voice of the streets is back in a big way.'

Anarchic, energetic and with a radical conscience at their core, LANKUM sing the old songs in new ways.



MACK FLEETWOOD

Ireland's finest tribute to one of the biggest bands ever returns to the Belfast Empire, in what's bound to be another sell-out spectacular. Emerging from the 60's as the world's best white blues outfit, the classic era of Fleetwood Mac formed around Lyndsey Buckingham and Stevie Nicks, giving us the canonical Rumours.

Excess, heartbreak, redemption and reformation, Fleetwood Mac's story is interpreted lovingly by the Dublin based-six piece. No matter what your favourite era, there's something for every fan of the group that helped define the 70s.



DAVID FORD ABE PARTRIDGE

Returning to the Belfast Empire, DAVID FORD has since proven himself one of the great voices of this early part of the 21st century. His one man show, aided only by the tasteful use of the loop pedal, has taken him around the world and back, honing his craft.

David's view of love, loss and rage have netted him international plaudits and awards while his wry wit and eye for social commentary wouldn't appear out of place on an Elvis Costello album.



KRIS BARRAS BAND

A cracking booking from the good folks at SD Entertainment, with the amazing KRIS BARRAS BAND hitting the Empire Music Hall this spooky season.


